Trevino asked if we could split grades? Create mixed class? Conflicting district policies are causing confusion. Could a substitute be found for the posted positions (K and 1st). Trevino asked which department we should ask for help, the suggestion was to go to Area Superintendent.

Approval of Title I funds will need to be approved by CAC before Principal Dwiggins can sign off on extra spending.

Neunaber commented: We need to speak up for our campuses because our schools are being stretched thin. "We have to keep speaking up for our school. Don't do this again." Windsor Park Committee will prioritize demanding from the district by keeping X number of teachers.

Wyatt used analogy of refunds at a retail store: This takes time.

Questions: Newneighbor asked what was status of nurse. Wyatt explained that we have a part-time Nurse and part-time SHA. Wyatt explained that our campus nurse and SHA have been used recently at other campus. Life Skills nurses are also on campus.

Goals:

Health: 7 teachers will participate in the Live Health Initiative, but only 4 participated. The campus did not meet this goal. Cordova asked how we keep record of personal vs. Campus staff initiatives. Juarez comments that records were kept when signing up. Briscoe comments that Aetna Health recently started a new program, too. Wyatt stressed importance of documenting, GoNoodle helps in this regard.

SEL: goal was 61%, only 51% met. Wyatt explains some of reasons why goal was not met (time, second step resource, mindfulness, etc.). Cordova clarified that Second Step was a resource when giving explicit SEL lesson, but that SEL is an umbrella term for general, every-day interpersonal learning that takes place all year. Goal is to implement more lessons, utilize Counselor Garcia to help guide our campus as needed.
